ABOUT THE THREE DAYS

The Three Days is the church's annual experience of the heart of the Christian faith. Because there ought to be no immersion into suffering without the gift of the resurrection, and there ought to be no Easter without Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, the three-part service known as The Three Days holds them all together in the mystery of Christ. Our remembering is more than a retracing of the last days of Jesus' life. Rather, throughout these Three Days—through word, sacrament, and ritual—we participate in the saving power of Jesus' Passover from death to life. As the Three Days begin, we are invited to glory in the cross of Christ: our salvation, our life, our resurrection. Some people know of this three-day worship in its Latin name, the Triduum.

Maundy "Commandment" Thursday

Thursday, March 28 - 7:00 pm

Maundy Thursday receives its name from the Latin *Mandatum*, which means, "command." On this night we hear Jesus' new commandment to love one another. The great command was given by Jesus when he washed the feet of the disciples. "I have given you an example that you also should do as I have done to you."

As Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, we are called to follow his example, living out our baptismal vocation with humility and care for one another, and especially for the poor and the unloved. Those who wish to have their feet washed this evening are invited to do so after receiving the bread and wine.

We gather around the Lord's table to remember the sacrifice of Jesus' life. His love was revealed in the emptying of his life for us. We share the holy meal, becoming what we eat and drink: the body of Christ, offering ourselves in love for the life of the world.

At the conclusion of the liturgy, the altar and chancel furnishings are removed, preparing the worship space for Good Friday. Through this stark ritual we recall that Jesus was abandoned by his followers, stripped of his dignity, and left to face the cross alone. We depart in silence, ready to continue the celebration of the Three Days on Good Friday.



Good Friday

Friday, March 29 - 7:00 pm

Tonight, we gather for the second part of our holy three-day service which began yesterday with Maundy Thursday and concludes tomorrow with the Easter Vigil.

In Latin, tonight's service is referred to as a *Tenebrae* service. The word Tenebrae means "darkness." Throughout the service, as each Scripture is read, one candle is extinguished. The increasing darkness symbolizes the flight and denial of the disciples and friends of Jesus. The moment of darkness recalls the death of Christ.

In this darkness there is but one light—the eternal light of Christ. Even though darkness settles upon the earth, the light of God reminds us of the never-failing presence of God's forgiveness and grace. The ancient title for this day—The Triumph of the Cross—reminds us that the church gathers not to mourn this day but to celebrate Christ's life-giving passion and to find strength and hope in the tree of life.

The assembly gathers in silence from last night.

Easter Vigil

Saturday, March 30 - 7:00 pm

This is the night! This is our Passover with Christ from darkness to light, from bondage to freedom, from death to life. Tonight is the heart of our celebration of the Three Days and the pinnacle of the church's year. The resurrection of Christ is proclaimed in word and sign, and we gather around a pillar of fire, hear ancient stories of our faith, give thanks for baptism, and share the food and drink of the promised land. Raised with Christ, we go forth into the world, aflame with the good news of the resurrection.

The lighting of a new fire takes place outside in the courtyard. An unlighted candle is given to each person.

WELCOME

GREETING

THE PASCHAL CANDLE IS LIT

The lit candle reminds us that Christ is our light, and this light will literally lead us tonight. So too, we remember that fire helps us recall the presence of God and the mystery of the divine. We may remember stories like Moses and the burning bush, the pillar of fire that guided the Israelites, and the tongues of fire on the disciples' head at Pentecost, to name a few.

PROCESSION

As the procession begins the assisting minister sings:



The procession continues. The individual candles are lit. Please tip the unlit candle toward the lit candle. When all the candles are lit, the assisting minister sings:




The procession continues. When the assembly is in place, the assisting minister sings:



EASTER PROCLAMATION

Just as the cross has symbolized for us the death of Christ, so now the paschal candle stands for the risen Christ, whose body, like the light from the candle, is given away without being lessened.

It is indeed right...by whose blood the doorposts of the faithful are made holy.





PRAYER OF THE DAY

The assembly is seated. Hand-held candles may be extinguished.

For years, people have gathered around a fire to tell their ancestral stories, and the Vigil of Easter is the chance for the church to do so. While twelve readings are appointed for this story time, tonight we will read five. Each reading offers a description of God, a metaphor of the resurrection, and a reference to baptism.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church. Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God, the powers of this world that rebel against God, and the ways of sin that draw you from God? **I renounce them.**

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism....and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

People of God, do you promise to support and pray for one another in your life in Christ? **We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.**




